2013 HIPPING RIESLING SPÄTLESE

The Hipping Vineyard is located in an exposed position on the Roter Hang where the southeast facing slope and south-facing slope meet. Its position in the Rotliegend rock strata between Brudersberg and Oelberg is significant and unites several outstanding preconditions for vines. The warmth of a broad lake-like section of the Rhine and intense sun exposure in a steep yet protected red shale site allow small Riesling grape bunches to develop intense aromas and flavours. Our prime parcel in Hipping in the east facing, steepest part, where the early morning sun wakes the vines. These attributes create a very special microclimate that yields wines of incredibly expressive exotic fruit and significantly creamy texture.

WINE:

From those deep red soils under Nierstein's famous Roten Hang, or red cliff, this is immediately winning in its fresh, ripe fruit. That fruit feels pristine and well-shaped, the pineapple notes framed by a cool, sparkly acidity and earthy richness.
